Title 24: CA Energy Codes and Lighting Controls Questions and Answers

Q: We know Title 24 are required in modern building but how does this apply to older buildings?

A: Title 24 is also required on most alteration and addition projects. Per Section 141.0 there are certain exceptions for alterations, but Title 24 is triggered when a permit is pulled or required by the AHJ.

Q: How can we integrate your courses into our colleges?

A: Our courses can fit into a variety of CCC Programs. NLCAA can come to the school to teach the students or the college instructors can complete the Train the Trainer program to offer our curriculum. Our curriculum can be broken down into 2, 4, 8, 16 or 24-hour classes.

Q: How portable are the lab boards?

A: The lab boards come in a set of 4, each board consists of a small box (roughly 14in wide, 18in deep and 24in tall) with a cord attached. The boards can be used anywhere as long as there is a power source.

Q: What type of certification is required to become an ATT?

A: To become an ATT, there is no required certification.

Q: How does a General Electrician become an ATT?

A: To become an ATT, a person must have a minimum of 3 years of verifiable experience with lighting controls and electrical distribution systems, complete the free, online, lighting control prerequisite courses and submit an application to NLCAA. NOTE: A person does not have to be a Certified Electrician and become an ATT.
